2	Reorganize the CCC Oversight Committee:  a) Review draft TOR for CCC-OC;  b) Review draft list of CCC OC membership;  c) Elect the two Co-Chairs	<ul> <li>Reorganize the CCC Oversight Committee: <ul> <li>Last week, we have a pre-oversight Committee meeting to bring some more new people on board.</li> <li>At the beginning of the new term of CCC, the CCC has just gone through the election process in Jan 2018. The CCC also asked OC to look at the composition of Oversight Committee C and update it.</li> <li>An updated list of CCC-OC membership has been shared with the members for review and comments during the meeting to confirm their interest to continue as OC members.</li> <li>To meet the GF requirement, look at the TOR of OC on the membership, the OC shall consist of two Co-Chairs and up to fifteen Ordinary Members, endorsed by the CCC. Membership of the CCC is not a prerequisite for the membership of OC.</li> <li>CCC has established a permanent oversight body (composed of CCC members and non-members) with adequate set of skills and expertise to ensure periodic oversight.</li> <li>When expertise is not available through CCC members, the CCC may decide to engage professionals as OC members. Normally should have all stakeholders represented. We have representative from community sector (KAP and PLWD) but one constituency is not represented: that's the government sector and we need to reach out to CCC. This has been an ongoing challenge for Cambodian sitting on this OC.</li> <li>The CCC Secretariat has contacted H.E. Dr. Tia Phalla and he is interested to become a member of the OC.</li> <li>All OC members must declare any conflict of Interest that will or could arise in the course of undertaking their oversight duties. All OC members will sign a COI declaration at the beginning of their service. In addition, whenever the situation arise, a member must immediately declare his or her conflict of interest. The member must recuse himself or herself from conflicted matters under discussion.</li> <li>Due to the need of increased OC members from government constituency and also due to limited participation from the current members, the meeting decided to postpone t</li></ul></li></ul>	Next steps: Update list of CCC OC members with indicated their main skills and expertise. 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3	Review draft Oversight workplan; - review amended draft GF expectatio ns from oversight role	Review draft oversight workplan:  A 1st draft CCC Oversight Workplan for 2018-2019 based on previous years was shared with OC members for discussion and further elaboration.  The meeting reviewed the GF requirement for Transitioning Model for CCM on:  Oversight Plan,  Composition of Oversight Committee and  Oversight process, this included:  Reviewing PU/DR  Supporting PR/Program Managers to resolve issues  Feedback  Accountability:  Sharing information  Parliament update  Health sector  LFA involvement  The meeting suggested Ms. Inga Oleksy, Co-Chair of CCC OC to verify the activities currently listed in the updated draft GF guidance for the CCC Oversight function and make sure that it is reflected in the draft CCC OC workplan and share the updated draft version of the next workplan for OC members for comments and inputs.  The next challenge will probably be to identify (or design) simple yet effective tools to capture the complex information and OC recommendations for further consumption and action by the CCC. In the past we had CCC Dashboard tools, but they became outdated and GF tried to introduce the PR Dashboards, but those were not fully implemented either both attempt to synthesize key grant information in a simple summary manner. While we were interested in using the PR Dashboards at one stage, the GF CT was not supportive of that.  This could also be a good subject for discussion during the upcoming CCC retreat (OC members have also been invited) - on 14-16 March in Battambang. The meeting agreed:  1) To have Dr. Bunthy call Dr. Huy Rekol, Director of CNM to obtain further details of his concerns  2) The CCC-OC Co-Chairs will reach out to the PR-UNOPS to organize a meeting at the end of the week (with a couple of OC members present also).
