Services provided at site and any relevant activity information:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Scale up the eleven components of the HIV Service Package & Boosted CoPCT for MARPs ▪ Provide support to suitable organizations to develop these services ▪ Deliver targeted drug related HIV/AIDS education and comprehensive risk reduction services for PWID and PWUD and their partners through outreach, DIC and Rehabilitation centre. ▪ Provide interventions set in the Boosted Continuum of Prevention to Care and Treatment for PWUD/PWID, including Needle and Syringe Program, HIV testing and counselling, condom use program and referral for Methadone Maintenance Treatment, STI, HIV care and treatment and reproductive services.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Ensure adequate organizational capacity to deliver effective services for PWID and PWUD ▪ Document, design and distribute local community based good practice materials for PWID and PWUD ▪ Target programs to support female PWID/PWUD, in particular street based sex workers. (For example, provide specific low-threshold services for women; upgrade NSP kits to include female hygiene products, a specific outreach team to reach street based sex workers and recruiting more female social and outreach workers).
Current issues facing program at site:	-Found in the consultation between NCHADs, NGOs and Health partners, the number of people who inject drugs reached by needle syringe program (NSP) in Phnom Penh was only 350.
Objective or reason for site visit:	To understand the current status of finding and serving unreached sub-populations of people who inject drugs (PWID) and to discuss challenges and solutions.
